ELECTION OF A PARENT GOVERNOR

I am writing to let you know that there is to be an election for a Parent Governor for our Governing Board. We also have a vacancy for a Co-opted Governor – for those interested in the Co-opted Governor role, contact for this role should be via election.gov@whitbyschool.co.uk, ensuring that the words, ‘Co-opted Governor’ are typed as the subject title of the email. We are seeking nominations for both this role and the Parent Governor role. Please find below information regarding the Parent Governor nomination and election process.

The Governing Board, along with the Head of School, have overall responsibility for the running of the school. The three core functions for all Governing Boards are as follows:

- to ensure that the school has a clear vision, ethos and strategic direction
- to hold the head to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils
- to oversee the financial performance of the school, making sure its money is well spent.

You do not need any specific qualifications to be a school governor. The most important thing is that you are interested in the success of the school and are prepared to play an active part in the work of the governing board. Parent Governors are valued members of the team. An effective board will have a range of skills, and we would welcome nominations

from parents with knowledge and experience of either school leadership and/or who have experience in industry/business.

There are some circumstances under which someone cannot serve as a school governor and these are detailed on the further information sheet attached to this letter.

Training and support will be available to help you develop into the role. This will include mentoring as well as access to external governor training.

If you feel that you can help in the capacity of a Parent Governor, please complete the nomination form [LINK](#) and return this by email to election.gov@whitbyschool.co.uk, ensuring that you type ‘Parent Governor Election’ in the subject title of your email. Nominations should be received no later than 12 noon on Monday 15 June 2026.

You should be aware that successful candidates will be required to:

- undergo a Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check
- sign a governors’ Code of Conduct
- provide details of relevant business and financial interests
- agree to the publication of some details on the school website and on the [Get Information about schools’ service](#).



If there are more applications than vacancies, an election will need to be held. Should this be the case, you will be contacted again with details of how you can vote and information about the candidates standing for election.

Eligibility

To be eligible to stand for election as a parent governor you must have parental responsibility for, or care for, a child or young person registered at the school on the date of the election. This date is deemed to be the closing date for the receipt of nominations, or the date on which the governor position becomes vacant, if elections are being carried out in advance.

Disqualification

A parent is disqualified from standing for selection if they are:

- an elected member of the local authority
- paid to work at the school for more than 500 hours in any consecutive 12-month period
- subject to any of the disqualifications under the School Governance (Constitution) (England) Regulations 2012. Full details will be supplied with the nomination papers.

Term of Office

The standard term of office is 4 years from the date of appointment. Parent Governors may continue to serve their full term of office even if their child leaves the school.

The Role of the Parent Governor

The role of the Parent Governor is not as a spokesperson for the views of parents. They are the same as any other governor on the board, providing a

‘parental viewpoint’ ie, acting as a representative of parents.

Can you be Removed from the Role?

There are some circumstances where governors can be removed from their role. These include repeated non-attendance at meetings, and behaviours not in accordance with the code of conduct.

Frequency of Meetings and Time Commitment Required

Meetings are held termly plus some additional committee meetings. Occasionally, ad-hoc ‘exceptional’ Full Governing Body meetings may be held. Meetings will be usually held on a Monday evening from 6.00pm until 8.00pm.

YOUR FUTURE - INSPIRING CHOICES

On Wednesday 20 May we welcomed Inspiring Choices to talk to our Year 12 students and explore their future plans and aspirations. This kick starts our 'Your Future' programme where students have the opportunity to explore the various pathways which are available after they finish their Sixth Form courses. Over the next few months we will explore the apprenticeship pathway, looking at Degree Apprenticeships as well as Level 4 and 5 apprenticeships and the best ways to secure these opportunities. We will also look at the process for applying to university, the system which is controlled by UCAS. This means researching what courses are available, what universities would be a good fit and the financial side of life at university. On Wednesday 17 June there is a UCAS Open Day at Leeds Beckett which will help students to start this process as well as connecting them with apprenticeship suppliers. For some students, they will be looking at the work opportunities that will exist and our programme will make sure that students know how to write a good covering letter for an application, create a suitable CV the skills needed in interviews. In addition, we will look at the various sources for finding suitable employment.

For parents who would like to understand a little more about the university route there is a very detailed guide for parents at this [WEBSITE](#). In addition, we will hold some parent sessions in September to help

answer any questions and support the application process. For students who are considering this as a route there are a number of summer schools being offered by universities to give a taste of the life and these often have a positive impact on offers of future courses. If you have any questions or would like further information please do let us know. As we said to the students before half term, in a years time they will be largely finished Sixth Form and we will be waving goodbye so now is the time to start planning!

PAID TRAVEL PERMIT APPLICATION

The 2026/27 online Paid Travel Permit Application is now available on the North Yorkshire Council Website.

If you had a pass this year, you need to re-apply for 2026/27.

Any spare seats left on our services (once the pupils who qualify for free transport have been allocated) are sold on a first come first served basis. Renewal applications take priority, if applied for by **30 June 2026**, otherwise they will be treated as a new application. You will be notified if your application has been successful by mid **August**. We can't guarantee that a seat will be available, so you must have an alternative method of transport planned in case you do not get a seat.

The full pass price for the 2026/27 academic year is £846. Single day options are available – see website for details.

If you are applying for a part week pass, please state which days you want the pass for in the free text box. If you want a single journey pass, please specify if this is mornings only or afternoons only. Part week passes are not available to Post 16 students.

IMPORTANT: Please ensure you read the terms and conditions when applying, as you are agreeing to them by submitting your application.

In particular, please note the list of reasons why your pass **can be retracted at any point** throughout the academic year. This is usually because we need the seat for a pupil who qualifies for free transport, or the service is renewed, and the vehicle capacity is reduced. If this happens you will be given 1 weeks' notice of our intention to withdraw the pass.

What Parents & Educators Need to Know about ALLERGIES & ANAPHYLAXIS

An allergy is an overreaction of the immune system to a food or substance that's usually harmless. Symptoms can be mild, but for some people they can be very serious. This is known as anaphylaxis.

HOW TO SAY ANAPHYLAXIS: ANA-FIL-AX-IS

ALLERGIES AND ANAPHYLAXIS

- Mild allergy symptoms are treated with antihistamines.
- Anaphylaxis is treated with adrenaline, which is administered via an adrenaline device, injected into the outer upper thigh or using a nasal device.
- Anaphylaxis is a medical emergency and a threat to life.



WHAT ADRENALINE DOES

Adrenaline reduces swelling, opens the patient's airways and raises their blood pressure. Patients must go to hospital for monitoring, as the reaction could return.



TWO DOSES:
0.15 mg or 0.3 mg

ANAPHYLAXIS SYMPTOMS

AIRWAY

Symptoms include swelling in the throat, tongue or upper airways; tightening of the throat; a hoarse voice; and difficulty swallowing.



BREATHING

Symptoms include persistent cough; sudden onset of wheezing; breathing difficulty; and noisy breathing.



CIRCULATION

Symptoms include pale and clammy skin; dizziness; feeling faint; sudden sleepiness; tiredness; confusion; and loss of consciousness.



In extreme cases of anaphylaxis, there could be a dramatic fall in the patient's blood pressure. The patient may become weak and floppy, and have a sense of something terrible happening. Any of the ABC symptoms listed above may lead to collapse and unconsciousness and, on rare occasions, be fatal.
